Dear All, The Third Sunday of Advent is called *Gaudete Sunday*. The term *Gaudete* refers to the first word of the Entrance Antiphon, "Rejoice." Rose vestments are worn to emphasize our joy that Christmas is near, and we also light the rose candle on our Advent wreath. As Christmas draws near, the Church emphasizes the joy which should be in our hearts over all that the birth of our Saviour means for us. The great joy of Christians is to see the day drawing nigh when the Lord will come again in His glory to lead them into His kingdom. The oft-repeated *Veni* ("Come") of Advent is an echo not only of the prophets but also of the conclusion of the Apocalypse of St. John: "Come, Lord Jesus," the last words of the New Testament.

Pope Francis, throughout his pontificate, has put much emphasis on joy and even dedicated an entire encyclical to the "Joy of the Gospel." He wrote in the opening paragraph about what should fill the hearts of every Christian.

The joy of the gospel fills the hearts and lives of all who encounter Jesus. Those who accept his offer of salvation are set free from sin, sorrow, inner emptiness and loneliness. With Christ joy is constantly born anew. In this Exhortation I wish to encourage the Christian faithful to embark upon a new chapter of evangelization marked by this joy, while pointing out new paths for the Church's journey in years to come.

May these last days of Advent be a time when we open our hearts to God's beauty, peace and love. Let us bring the light of joy to all whom we encounter.

The Suffering Church

During the Deanery meeting on Tuesday, we heard from Mr Stephen Riedlinger of 'Aid to the Church in Need' (ACN). Founded in 1947, this international charity supports suffering and persecuted Christians throughout the world. Pope Benedict XVI made it a 'Pontifical Foundation' of the Church in recognition of the vital work done by this organisation.

Unfortunately, we very rarely hear about Christian persecution in the news and media. Mr Riedlinger reminded us that **one in seven** Christians in the world are persecuted. He presented the ACN's report 'Persecuted and Forgotten? A report on Christians oppressed for their faith' which highlighted 18 countries where Christians are particularly suffering in the world today. This makes for harrowing reading and reminds us that, in the words of Pope Francis, "the age of martyrs is not yet over, even today we can say, in truth, that the Church has more martyrs now than during the first centuries."

Mr Riedlinger highlighted a few stories for us which have shown that many governments are not interested in protecting Christians and, in some cases, have been actively complicit in the persecution of Christians. For example, Erin Shehata, a young Christian woman, from Egypt was kidnapped at the start of year by the Muslim Brotherhood and has not been seen by her family since her disappearance. Hers is just one story among so many...

As we continue our Advent journey, let us remember in prayer our Christian brothers and sisters who face continued acts of violence and oppression for following the Christ child. One initiative of ACN is to 'Go to Mass for someone who can't' – what better present can we give than to go to Mass and stand in solidarity with those who truly suffer for the faith?

As a parish we might like to explore other ways we can help support the work of ACN. I look forward to hearing any suggestions.

Christ Jesus, light of the world, strengthen all Christians who are persecuted because of their faith in You.
