Dear All, On this second Sunday of Lent, God makes a covenant with Abraham, rewarding his faith. Throughout Lent, we are reminded of God's faithfulness, and the responsorial psalm reflects Abram's trust in God: The Lord is my light and my salvation. The biblical figure of Abraham, described in the Roman Canon as "our father in faith," was truly a man of constant faith and trust. Our faith today benefits from his revelation to steadfastness in the Lord. In fact, all the readings invite us to reflect on faith, transformation, and God's promises. These themes help us to grow closer to God during Lent.

The Transfiguration account gives us a glimpse of the heavenly glory. The "transfiguration" in the Mass is the source of our strength: In each Mass, the bread and wine we offer on the altar become "transfigured" or transformed into the living Body and Blood, soul and Divinity of the crucified, risen, and glorified Jesus. Just as Jesus' Transfiguration was meant to strengthen the apostles in their time of trial, each Holy Mass should be our source of Heavenly strength against temptations, and for our Lenten renewal.

Take time this Lent to build up your own trust in the Lord. Make time for Him. Perhaps come to a weekday Mass, attend the Stations of the Cross, and make time for that real encounter with renewal in the sacrament of confession. The '24 Hours for the Lord' initiative is also a great opportunity to spend time with the Lord in prayer and adoration. It is a moment to experience the mercy of God, which gives the certainty that before the Lord no one will find a judge, but a father who welcomes us, consoles us and shows us the way to renewal. ### Dear Friends,

You may be aware that the community of St Gregory's, formerly at Downside Abbey, found a temporary home at Buckfast whilst they entered a process of discernment regarding their future. Following a lengthy period of discussion and fraternal exchange between our two communities, we have both voted and agreed that St Gregory's would come and live alongside us here at Belmont. Whilst formally we will remain separate communities, in practice we will live a common life together. St Gregory's have said: "Our shared hope is that we will be able to support and strengthen each other in faithfulness to our Benedictine vocation and that eventually we will form a single, united community at Belmont."

Strengthened by the arrival of St Gregory's we will continue to build on the Benedictine tradition of hospitality, retreat-giving, pastoral care and outreach. We look forward to opening our new quest facilities this summer. The foundation of our life will continue to be our liturgy and prayer. The tradition of our two houses, together with the rich history of English monasticism with its saints is there to inspire us. The Rule of St Benedict will unite us in this endeavour.

You already know that two members of St Gregory's, Fr James and Fr John, are looking after the parish here of St Francis Xavier. Likewise, Fr Richard, a monk of St Gregory's has been Novice Master at our foundation in Peru for a number of years. Abbot Nicholas is well known and loved by many given the years he spent at Belmont as Prior and Parish Priest. We know that the wider Belmont family, our friends, oblates and parishioners will make the Community of St Gregory's and in time the wider Gregorian family very welcome at Belmont. We look forward to this new and exciting chapter in the life of our communities.
