Sandro Botticelli's The Mystical Nativity painted around 1500 is a complex painting that symbolizes faith, prophecy, and salvation. It's a visual sermon that represents a teaching of Savonarola's about the second coming of Christ. Millenarianism

The painting is inspired by the belief that the world will end and be transformed as predicted in the Book of Revelation.

Unknown martyrs

The three men may represent unknown martyrs being raised up at Christ's second coming. Other elements of the painting that contribute to its meaning include:

- **Angels**: Represent faith, hope, and charity.
- **The child**: The child rests on a sheet that evokes the shroud in which his body will one day be wrapped.
- **The cave**: The cave in which the scene is set calls to mind the child's tomb.
- **The Kings**: The Kings on the left bear no gifts, but their own devotion.

The inscription: An inscription above the composition speaks of the "the troubles of Italy" but also the second coming of Christ.

Glory to God in the highest!

In that Child, in fact, God-Love is manifest: God comes without weapons, without force, because he does not want to conquer, so to speak, from the outside, but rather wants to be freely received by the human being. God makes himself a defenceless Child to overcome pride, violence and the human desire to possess.
