<u>Walsingham</u> "England's Nazareth"

one time, the shrine of Walsingham was as famous as Rome, Jerusalem, and Compostella. It became a major centre of Marian devotion. So great was the nation's devotion to the Mother of God that England become known as "Our

Lady's Dowry," a title reflecting England as the special possession of Mary and under her protective care.

The story of Walsingham begins way back in 1061, Our Lady appeared to Richeldis de Faverches, a devout Norman widow. In a vision she showed her the house where the Annunciation had taken place and where the Holy Family had lived. Richeldis was then requested to build a similar house at Walsingham and was promised: "All who are in any way distressed, or in need, let them seek me there in that little house you have made at Walsingham. To all that seek me there shall be given succour."

For hundreds of years "England's Nazareth" was a powerful place of praver and intercession. Alas, Walsingham did not escape the destruction of the Protestant Reformation. In 1538, the priory was sold, and the statue of Our Lady Walsingham was burnt in a wanton act of vandalism. But all was not lost. At the end of the 19th century, Charlotte Boyd, an Anglican convert, managed to buy the disused 14th century Slipper Chapel, where formerly pilgrims had stopped to remove their shoes so they could walk the final mile to the Shrine barefoot. She restored the Slipper Chapel and donated it to the Benedictines of Downside Abbey. They eventually handed it over to the Diocese of Northampton, and on 19th August 1934, the Mass was celebrated there, once again, when the chapel was formally declared by Cardinal Francis Bourne as the National Catholic Shrine to Our Lady.
