Dear All, This weekend we have a pastoral letter for the Holy Family from Archbishop Mark who writes about Jesus' childhood and the virtues of the family life. The Gospel writers relate very little about the life of Jesus from his birth to the beginning of his public ministry, but when they do mention the Holy Family, they are almost always on the move: fleeing to Egypt, going up to Jerusalem for purification, and returning to find the lost child Jesus.

This sense of a family on the move might resonate with many families here at St Francis Xavier's. There are many families living in different countries, unable to spend Christmastide together; changes at home, work, and in health can all reveal the insecurity of life for many at this time. Pope Francis often says that we are not just living in an era of change but in a change of era. Our parish community, then, can be a source of faith, hope, and stability for many who find this time of year difficult. Saint Paul gives us a programme for the coming year: "Put on, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience."

The events surrounding the birth of our Saviour fade away, and the Holy Family lives a very ordinary domestic life. As such, they provide a model for families to imitate, as the words of the Collect pray: "that we may imitate them in practising the virtues of family life and in the bonds of charity."

Archbishop Mark also encourages families to go on pilgrimage during this Jubilee year. Our own Church has been designated as one of the pilgrim churches for the archdiocese, along with Belmont Abbey and so look at for events for you and your family to get involved in as we travel together as pilgrims of hope. The Sanctuary lamp, hanging over the small mass altar and visible to all, was given by Mrs Isabella Rogers who was sacristan to the Church for many years. This light burns all the time as the Blessed Sacrament is reserved in the tabernacle behind the High Altar.

The gilded tabernacle is a replica of the tabernacle in the Chapel

of the Blessed Sacrament in St Peter's in Rome. There are two inscriptions: round the base are, in Latin, 'My flesh is food indeed' and round the centre 'Behold the bread of Angels. Truly the Bread of the Children of Men. O Good Shepherd, Thou art our Feast, our support. Jesus have mercy on us.'

In the reserved hosts we have the real presence of Christ. At every Mass, the bread and wine offered become the Body and Blood of Christ; Christ is present in a unique way in those species reserved.

St Thomas Aquinas, a Domican friar, theologian, philospher, and Doctor of the Church was born 1225 and died 1274 wrote the following on the Eucharist: He offered his body to God the Father on the altar of the Cross as a sacrifice for our reconciliation; and he shed his blood for our ransom and our cleansing, so that we might be redeemed from wretched captivity and cleansed from all sins.

How precious and wonderful is this banquet, which brings us salvation and full of delight! What could be more precious? .....At this meal Christ, the true God, is set before us to eat. What could be more wonderful than this sacrament?

No sacrament contributes more to our salvation than this; for it purges away our sins, increases our virtues, and nourishes our minds with an abundance of all the spiritual gifts.

It is offered in the Church for the living and the dead, so that it may be beneficial to all, as it was instituted for the salvation of all.
